Parent Heart Watch and HeartSine Technologies Launch the 2013 Heart Avengers AED Grant Program for Private Schools

Twenty AEDs Will Be Awarded in April 2013

Chicago..... Every year in schools across the country, children and adults alike are struck by Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA). The difference between life and death often depends upon how prepared a school is to handle an SCA event. In an effort to save young lives from SCA on school property, Parent Heart Watch (PHW) and HeartSine Technologies today announced the creation of the *2013 Heart Avengers AED Grant Program*, which will be awarding twenty AEDs to deserving private schools.

According to Parent Heart Watch, the national voice solely dedicated to protecting youth from sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) and preventable sudden cardiac death (SCD), an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) is a crucial component in the cardiac chain of survival. "Once you recognize someone is in cardiac arrest, you should call 9-1-1, immediately start chest compressions, retrieve an AED and initiate the device. According to a recent study from the University of Washington, out-of-hospital SCA survival rates are between 5-and 10 percent. However, when CPR and an AED are used immediately, it jumps to 64 percent," said PHW Executive Director Michele Snyder.

The 2013 Heart Avengers AED Grant Program affords private schools the opportunity to receive a HeartSine Samaritan PAD 300P Defibrillator, wall case, CPR and AED training and support in developing an Emergency Action Plan by getting school personnel and students involved in the process.

Marc Lawrence, Senior Vice President, HeartSine Technologies, Inc. notes "Sudden Cardiac Arrest can happen to anyone, anytime, anywhere. Our philosophy at HeartSine is to do everything possible to curb
